What is SMA?

SMA stops your muscles from growing strong. This makes it hard for babies like you to sit up, move, and breathe.

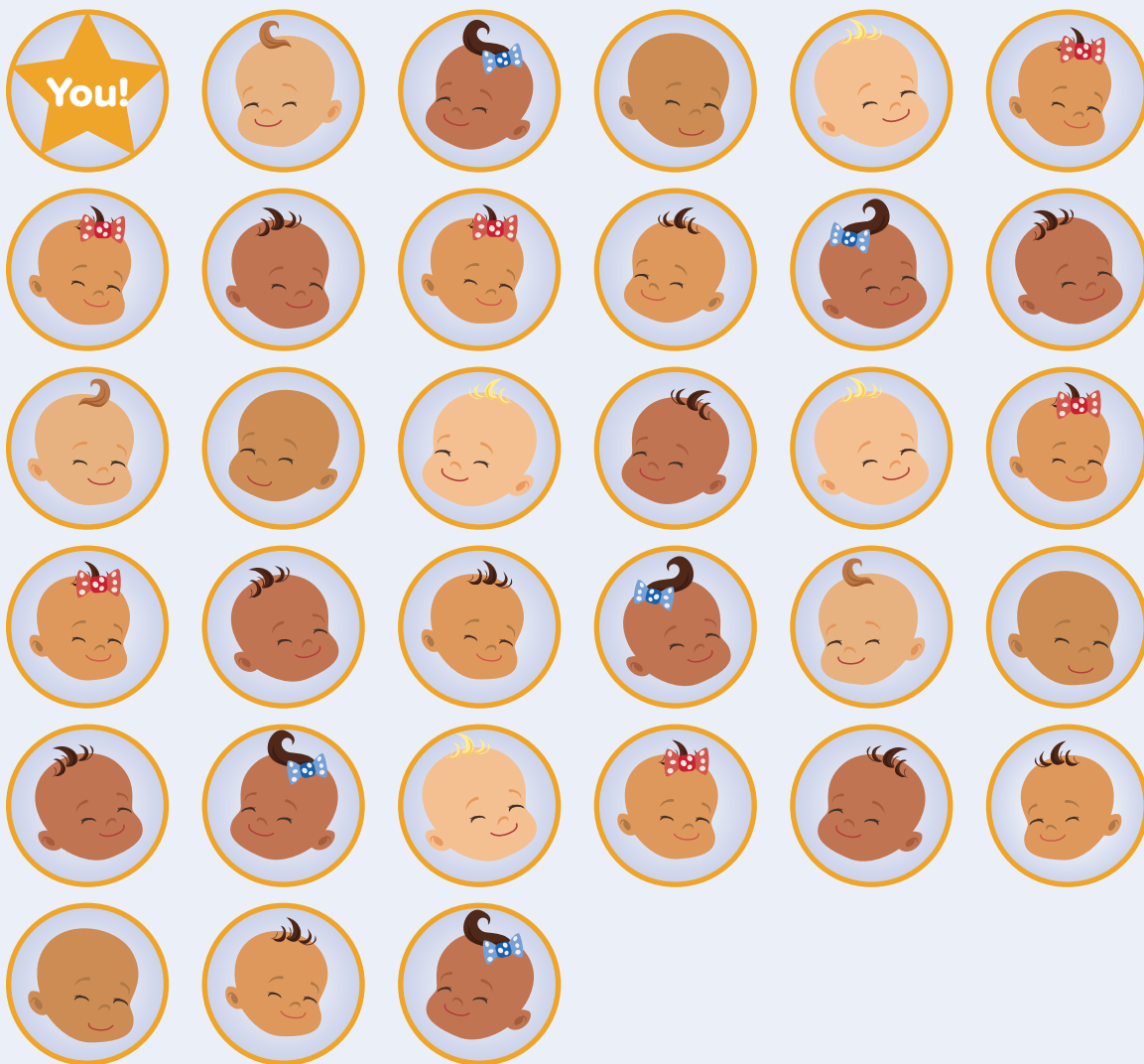




When you were a baby, you
helped doctors learn about
a new medicine.

Doctors wanted to learn if the new medicine could help you and other babies with SMA sit up on their own.





You and 32 other babies got
the new medicine.

You went to the doctor many times,
and they took videos of you.



The doctors watched to see if you
could sit up all by yourself. They
watched the other babies, too.



14 babies who got the new medicine sat up by themselves at least one time before they turned one and a half years old.

18 babies who got the new medicine could not sit up on their own before they turned one and a half years old.





When you visited the doctor, they also checked on your health.

These visits helped the doctors learn about the new medicine for you and the other babies with SMA.
